FUGITIVE SAFE SURRENDER PROGRAM (FSS) JUNE 25 – 28, 2014

IN CONJUNCTION WITH OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL AND 18 SUMMIT COUNTY PARTNERS

Location: The House of the Lord, 1650 Diagonal Road, Akron, OH, 44320

While the Fugitive Safe Surrender Program (FSS) is not an amnesty program, FSS does give people with outstanding felony and misdemeanor warrants a chance to resolve those issues in a church or other community-based setting. The Fugitive Safe Surrender program will take place from Wednesday, June 25, 2014 to Saturday, June 28, 2014 at the House of the Lord Church, 1650 Diagonal Road, in Akron.

There are 6,000 felony warrants in Summit County and 16,000 misdemeanor warrants in Akron, Barberton and Stow. During Fugitive Safe Surrender, judges give careful consideration to those who voluntarily turn themselves in. Fugitives are strongly encouraged to do so, since following the Fugitive Safe Surrender Summit County event, local law enforcement will do a warrant sweep.

The Courts which will participate include the Akron Municipal Court, along with Barberton and Stow, Summit County Common Pleas and Summit County Domestic Relations Court. Persons who have outstanding traffic tickets or a license suspension will have the opportunity to speak with representatives from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV). On June 25, 26, 27, and 28, people with outstanding misdemeanor and low-level felony warrants from Summit County can arrive between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., without registering in advance, at the FSS location: The House of the Lord, 1650 Diagonal Road, Akron, OH, 44320.
